

## IBDP – Visual Arts Equipment List

For an enriching experience in our Visual Arts IB Diploma course at King's InterHigh, we suggest acquiring the specific items listed below.

Additionally, we encourage the reuse of materials and the adoption of environmentally friendly or sustainable options for your projects.

# Required



## Web Camera

- ✓ Students must have a separate web camera to display their portfolio work live during lessons.



## Printer Access

- ✓ Students need access to a printer for printing resource imagery and other necessary materials.



## Basic Art Kit

- ✓ Minimum Requirement: Students must have a basic art kit (details below).
- ✓ Additional Items: Students should check the **Materials List** each term for any additional items needed.



## Camera

- ✓ Students need a camera or camera phone to document their artworks and progress. This is uploaded to their digital portfolios.
- ✓ Ensure that images uploaded are of good resolution.



## Storage

- ✓ Students need a safe and secure place to store portfolio work between lessons and until results are posted at the end of the two-year qualification.



## Basic Art Supplies

Students may choose to specialize in one or more of the following areas to explore ideas, convey experiences, or respond to themes: drawing, lens/light-based media (photography), mixed-media, printing, painting, installation, sculpture etc.

Depending on the chosen media, additional bespoke materials may be required. Please note that all students enrolled at King's InterHigh will have access to **Adobe Creative Cloud** including Photoshop and Lightroom. Ensure your learning device has the capability to manage downloading these.

- ✓ **Web camera:** Separate to your learning device. A document camera is ideal.
- ✓ **Camera Phone:** to document their artworks and progress
- ✓ **Paper:** Cartridge paper or sketchbook (minimum 140gsm). Flat cartridge paper in a portfolio is easier to photograph.
- ✓ **Pencils:** Sketching pencils (2B, 4B, 6B) and colouring pencils
- ✓ **Erasers:** Standard or kneadable erasers.
- ✓ **Pens:** Fine liner pens (coloured and black ink pens/markers/felt tips).
- ✓ **Paints:** Watercolour paints (bricks or liquid) or poster/tempera paints; acrylic paints (minimum: red, blue, yellow, white, black).
- ✓ **Brushes:** Soft brushes.
- ✓ **Ink:** Indian ink and ink pen/liquid inks.
- ✓ **Adhesives:** Glue (PVA or Pritt-Stick).
- ✓ **Tools:** Scissors.
- ✓ **Charcoal:** Willow charcoal.
- ✓ **Found Materials:** Old papers (newspaper, magazines, old letters, tin foil, cardboard, etc.).
- ✓ **Miscellaneous:** Water cup, kitchen towel, masking tape.

### Additional (Check as required)

- ✓ **Clay:** Air-dry clay.
- ✓ **Tools:** Modelling tools.
- ✓ **Plaster:** Plaster of Paris.
- ✓ **Lino:** Lino and cutting tools.
- ✓ **Clay:** Play-Doh clay for printmaking, casting, and sculpture samples.
- ✓ **Glue Gun:** Glue gun and glue sticks (optional).
